

Zero Conditional

The **zero conditional** is used...

- When we talk about real repeated actions in the present.
- Facts which are generally true or scientific facts.
- The condition always has the same result.

If + **present simple, present simple.**

Examples:

- 1) If I **play** with fire, I **get** burned.
- 2) If you **practise** speaking English, you **become** better at it.
- 3) If you **heat** ice, it **melts**.
- 4) If you **stand** in the rain, you **get** wet.
