## **MUST**

## Must vs. Have to:

MUST expresses obligation imposed by the speaker while HAVE TO expresses external obligations.

-Teacher: You must complete this essay by Friday.

-Student: We have to complete this essay by Friday

It is more common to use **Have to** instead of **Must** in questions.

-Does he have to do the test?

We use HAD TO instead of MUST in the past tense.

-I had to pay my speeding ticket yesterday.

Obligation
-You must wear a seatbelt when you drive.

Deduction
(certain
something is true)
-Look at all that
snow. It must be
cold outside.

**Emphasize Necessity** 

- Plants **must** have light and water to grow.

Strong recommendation

-We **must** get together for dinner soon.

Mustn't =
Prohibition
- You mustn't use
your phone while
driving.
